## Bishop's Message: Lent - The Time For Karuna



Dear loving Brothers and Sisters in Christ,  
The spirit of Lent can't be limited just to the abstinence of food because it would not mean much as so many of our brethren are undergoing this suffering daily. Often Lent is a synonymous for Fasting which is obviously very important for our spiritual growth but I would like to invite you all to mark this liturgical season in yet another way. "Seeing the people, He felt compassion for them." Looking around all of you would unanimously agree that cum patire is the need of the time. St. Paul in his second letter to the Corinthians write, "Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves received from God."

Physical hunger is not the only kind from which humanity suffers: many of them are also hungry and thirsty for dignity, freedom, justice, and for food for their minds and souls. The people of God should have the feeling of empathy towards them. Sharing things does not consist only of giving away what we do not need; sometimes it also consists of giving away what we do need, like the widow in the Gospel who knew that what she was giving away was the only means for her livelihood. Let us always remember that to share is to give to others what God intends for them and which is only entrusted to us.

Let us reflect whether we are still standing idle in the market place because no one has called us to work! The vineyard of Christian Charity is short of workers; the Church is calling you to it. In this Lenten season which is a preparation for the Resurrection of our Lord, let us renew and re-live the real spirit of Lent.

## Editorial: Lent: LENDING our Hearts...



During a Lenten collection a group of people approached a man. He said to them, "Do you know that my mother is ill and under treatment for the last seven years, my elder brother will be undergoing a major heart surgery in the next week, my younger brother's daughter is doing her third year nursing and struggling to pay her fees. Hearing a series of issues one of them said, "Sorry we were not aware of your problems, we will pray for you". The man replied, "That is not the matter, I don't even give a penny to any of them then why I do have to give to you".

Pope Francis in his Apostolic Exhortation, The Joy of the Gospel, tells that "in itself mercy is the greatest of all the virtues, since all the other revolves around it... (p.36). He says "God shows that poor "his first mercy"... Inspired by this, the church has made an option of primacy in the exercise of Christian charity, to which the whole tradition of the church bears witness" (p.153).

Lent invokes us to LEND our hearts to our needy brethren and exercise the Christian Charity in its true spirit which resounds in Isaiah 58:7-8 that:

"Is not this the kind of fasting I have chosen: to loose the chains of injustice and untie the cords of the yoke, to set the oppressed free and break every yoke? Is it not to share your food with the hungry and to provide the poor wanderer with shelter— when you see the naked, to clothe them, and not to turn away from your own flesh and blood? Then your light will break forth like the dawn, and your healing will quickly appear; then your righteousness will go before you, and the glory of the LORD will be your rear guard.

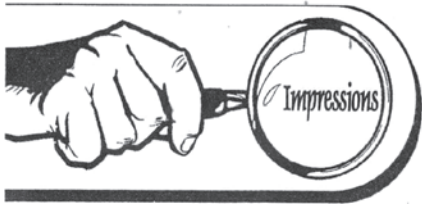

### Love of Jesus impels...

I can do all things through him who strengthens me (Phil- 4:13)

I cannot but extend my heart and hands to him/her who is not able to handle his own affairs by himself, who cannot stand on his own legs because of the rejection by the near ones...

Once I see abandoned brethren I do not think of the consequences like where to go, what to do with them, how to manage etc. For example I used to be a frequent visitor to Kalamboli Jyothi Aids center. Once I noticed that a sister was attending to patients barehanded and I asked her why she was not using gloves. She replied that if by tending to these poor souls should she get affected, she would accept it as God's disposition.

This may be the Holy Spirit's influence on me. By God's grace I was able to lend a helping hand to more than 38 destitutes. One such case was an elderly person found at the railway station. It was a phone call from a friend which led me to this elderly person. On asking him, he said he was an alcoholic who had left his house about 11 years back. He worked in many hotels for the past 11 years and eventually became an alcoholic. He said he had a wife and three kids of which he had not seen his third kid. He was taken to Seal ashram and later to Kalamboli MGM hospital. After two days the person expired. As I didn't want to do the funeral of this person as an unwanted body, I requested to keep this body in mortuary. With the help of Kanjurmarg church members I started to enquire about his family. After two days their family was located in Vikhroli (E). I personally went to their house and told them about him. It was what made me cry when this last kid fell on my feet and thanked me for at least getting her father's body, whom she had always wanted to meet.

As a member of the church it is my experience that the Church extends its tender care to all who act in this way. Even though we are in the midst of manifold affairs, if we have Jesus in mind then we will be able to see, hear and impelled to act on behalf of Jesus.

JAN (Jubilee Action Network) has helped me to grow in this direction. You have experienced the tender care and concern of the Diocese of Kalyan regarding the neglected and sick. I also acknowledge the ever readiness of Fr. Paul Kunduparambil to support the Jan volunteers as they are appreciated for their commitment and dedication..... in short, I am happy to be a Jan volunteer!

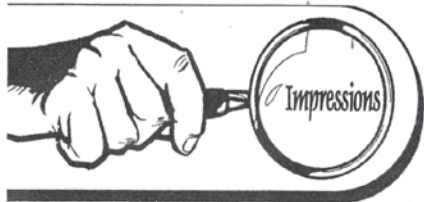

### BHARARI: News Concept & New Horizons

Project BHARARI is a “Child Focused Community development” program. We conducted various get together of the parents of 16 tribal villages for the purpose of making them understand the project “Bharari” and their participation in it. The response was good and in the process we realized that our tribals are hoping to bring some change in their life though partnership with Karunya Trust. They believe that Karunya Trust is a free gift of God to them and to their children who don’t dare to dream of better and bright future. In the leaders meeting some of the concerns shared or are bothering some of the tribal leaders are, in this fast changing society do they and their children have any place to hope for a better... Yes, we together shall strive for that hope which will change our tribal children’s future.

### PARTICIPATORY RURAL APPRAISAL (PRA): for Sustainable Development

From 18th Dec. to 30th December participatory rural appraisal was conducted in 16 villages under CFCD (Child focus Community Development). We need to enhance people’s participation in this project more which will have sustainability. We need to update them with available government schemes and how to tap it. Women’s participation was more than men. Women feel the need of getting help and guidance from Karunya to change their standard of living. We need to join hands with all the likeminded people which give us more strength to reach out maximum people in need.

### Bharari: Take off to a New Life...

Survey of 16 villages was an eye opener for all of us. We found that our tribals don’t own even the basic needed assets i.e. no land, low daily wages, drinking habits among the men folk, no education so no good job. Odd jobs which demands hard work, no enough food thus health deterioration. A lifelong debt which leads bonded labours... endless problems and few solutions... best solution is to build community organization to raise their voice collectively. Baseline survey has made us understand the actual existing situation of our tribal people. Our facilitation will bring substantial change in the lives of the people.

### CAPACITY BUILDING OF THE STAFF:

It is a need for the time that our staff’s capacity must be enhanced in order to empower the people whom we wish to bring in the main stream of society. Thus various trainings were organized for staff such as water & soil conservation at Ahmदनगर from 12th to 15th Jan, SHG & Federation at Ranchi on 18th to 26th. Basic training on how to teach children who are slow learners, how to identify the malnourished children and what supplement must be given to them was conducted. Staff meeting for the review of the various service rendered to the people is a regular activity of Karunya Trust. Evaluation was conducted of the work done. We are happy that our beneficiaries are open and have accepted us. We realize that we need to enhance their participation, to certain extent they have understood that at every stage they need to contribute for the betterment of their society.

Winners were extremely happy and the team has learned that the children are very capable if they are given an opportunity to express themselves with the support of their parents. Also it can be improved with proper training.

### Enhancing Education through TUITION CENTERS:

Tuition centers inauguration on 17th of January in the three villages that are Morachapada, Katakariwadi, Pimploliwadi. The purpose of it is to empower our children and make them smart and successful in their academic studies. Parents are very happy because children are able to sit and study and learn more.

Gradually people understand that we are trying to help them to participate in their own development. They have begun to trust us. People’s support and participation is very important for their development. We decided to focus on the children who are really in need of our assistance. We need to promote the education of the children and therefore we shall be very careful in identifying and selecting the children for sponsorship. Identification of the malnourished children was done and along with it we have identified the children for sponsorship. The meetings were conducted to explain the people why we need to have the sponsorship and who are selected and what will be the role of parents and the community in the sponsorship process.

### DENTAL CHECKUP AND AWARENESS

Dental checkup and demonstration of brushing the teeth in Savorwadi, Devoliee, Kanoorwadi, Katakariwadi, Kuradapada, Pimploliwadi, Morachpada on 30th & 31st Jan. 250 children’s dental checkup was done. Around 225 parents were given awareness of keeping teeth healthy. Interviews of the parents were taken. We realized that most of our village’s children have very bad teeth and we need to plan a well dental program for them to protect from further damages to the teeth. We also need to spread awareness and educate our parents regarding healthy teeth.

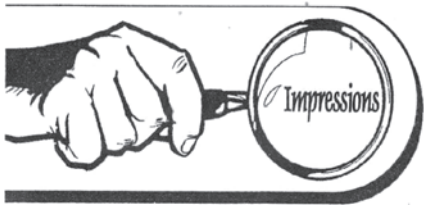

The young adolescent girls had put up a traditional dance of the Kerala muslims. It is called opana- a dance performed by friends of the bride a night before her wedding. It was a heart cheering performance to see the girls all dressed and teasing the bride. Well if the girls can, the boys can too. They had put up a mime based on the Life House skit. It received a thundering applause. Well if the children were able to put up something, the mothers were not far behind. They sang the commencing prayer song. What was different is that despite Marathi not being their mother tongue, they sang a whole Marathi bhajan.

After all the cultural events, awards were given to appreciate students who had given their best during this academic year. All this would not have been achievable without the hardworking and passionate staff at Gyansaathi. Their services were appreciated with an honour. Just when everyone thought that it was all over, the young dynamic girls came up with a surprise performance. They had performed a patriotic dance choreographed by themselves. At the end of which, all were left speechless at the heart warming performance of these girls. As mentioned before, performance contains infinite possibilities. With each Annual Day, our children have just proved that. Sincere thanks to all our benefactors, donors, volunteers and well wishers for their prayers and support without which Gyansaathi would not have reached the heights it has reached.

A long awaited dream of Gyansaathi has been a vocational training centre of its own. In November, this dream came true. The project has rented a two room space to conduct the vocational training from 1st November, 2013. It has 24 hours water supply and electricity along with bathroom facilities. It is well furnished. It has been equipped with 5 sewing machines and 3 computers. The adult literacy class which was conducted within a dimly lit space in the community has now shifted to the new space. Although it is a little away from the community, the number of women coming have not reduced but has rather increased.



This is not all. As the world moves closer to a digitalized world, the students and their families at Gyansaathi too have taken their steps towards getting digitalized. Computer classes have begun not only for children but their mothers as well. As the saying goes- there is no age for learning, no matter what the obstacles may be. The mothers were initially hesitant but have firmly decided that they want to grow with the changing world.



This is not all. To enhance their skills, tailoring has also started. This is based on our tie up Yuva Parivartan. It is a 20 days training course. The students will receive a certificate from the Ministry of Labour and Employment at the end. Thus, Gyansaathi has derived more happiness from learning new skills for a meaning purpose.

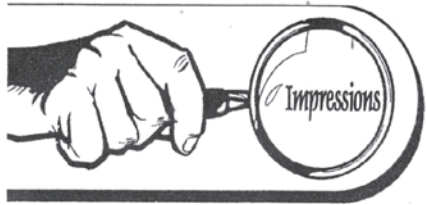
The final visit was to the BMC Ward office- M-East ward on 26th February, 2014.

## RETURN GIFT

When I wrote a fundraising appeal for Karunya Trust during the SCMM2013 (Standard Chartered Mumbai Marathon), I had no idea how the response would be and what was in store for me. Until then my “giving back to the society” was limited to my annual donation to a NGO and all I expected in return was a 80G tax relief certificate. This was the first time I had identified myself with a cause and made a personal appeal to my friends and colleagues. So far, however, I hadn't got out of my chair! The response I got to my appeal was overwhelming. It was as if people were just waiting for a chance to do good. The tremendous response to my appeal made me feel personally responsible to ensure the funds were well spent.

It was time now to get off the chair! Rose, my friend from college, has been involved with the Gyaansathi project from the inception and it was she who had introduced me to Karunya Trust in the first place. She said a good way to start would be to see the basti (settlement) for myself. The memory of my first visit to the basti in Rafik Nagar, Govandi and the Gyaansathi school is a blur of stark images and acrid smells.

This was a totally different world and there were just too many things to see, understand and assimilate. Of course slums are nothing new to a Mumbaikar and I passed by this area every time I drove to Pune. From far it was just a slum, but walking in the basti along with Rose and meeting the people was totally different... the sounds were real, the stench was real, the gutter overflowing at my feet was real and the person describing how much he had to pay to fill up a Adhaar card form, was real. The plight of the young children was even more gut wrenching. The dumping ground which is the source of livelihood for these children was also their worst enemy.. eating away at their health and corroding their self worth. The whole area was enveloped in a cloud of despondency.

In the midst of all this, the Gyaansathi school was a safe harbour. In the basti there was squalor and abuse and addiction. In the school there was clean water and laughter and poetry. The school was perhaps the only ray hope for these children and I knew immediately, that I wanted to help it grow. I had no idea how I could help. I knew I could never match the dedication and sheer grit of the Gyaansathi staff. It takes a special kind of strength to go into the basti each day, coax the parents to leave their children at the school, teach the children, serve them food and at the end of the day play and dance with them. Since I could visit only on weekends, Rose suggested that instead of teaching the children, I teach the staff. They were keen to learn English and Computers. I was comfortable with the subjects but I had never taught before. I reckoned there was nothing to lose, even if I didn't do a good job at teaching, the staff would at least get a weekly break from the routine.

After a couple of weeks, I realized that the staff were actually beginning to enjoy my classes. Secretly I was relieved that I had discovered one real life skill (working for years in a faceless multinational can leave you with such doubts). Visiting the school every Saturday morning became my new routine. Prashanti, Sakina, Komal, Foziya, Salma Apa, Suvarna tai, Somanth, Pooja and Firoz became my students as well as my heroes. I watched them as they tackled a new challenge everyday with a doggedly cheerful attitude and I knew I could never let them down.

In the last two years I've watched this school grow into a big support centre for these kids and even their families. We have started activities like vocational training for teenagers and now adult literacy for their parents. This year we raised even more funds during SCMM2014. The new vocational centre can now afford to provide offer more facilities and courses. Coming face to face with people who have been denied even the most basic human rights has made me painfully aware of how lopsided our progress has been. Understanding the day to day struggle of these children has given me a deeper appreciation of the comforts we take for granted in our cushy lives. Observing the work



of the Gyaansathi staff and other social workers has given me a cause to believe that in spite of all that is wrong in the system there is still hope.

Experiencing the infectious laughter and the indomitable spirit of these children has given me proof that goodness shines in all of us. I feel truly grateful for all that I have got from Gyaansathi. All I expected in return was a 80G tax certificate!

## Being in the image of God:

Extract from “The Human Person As The “Imago Dei” (Extract From Compendium Of The Social Doctrine Of The Church)”

The fundamental message of Sacred Scripture proclaims that the human person is a creature of God, and sees in his being the image of God the element that characterizes and distinguishes him... Therefore, “being in the image of God the human individual possesses the dignity of a person, who is not just something, but someone. He is capable of self-knowledge, of self-possession and of freely giving himself and entering into communion with other persons. Further, he is called by grace to a covenant with his Creator, to offer him a response of faith and love that no other creature can give in his stead”[204].

Love must be present in and permeate every social relationship. This holds true especially for those who are responsible for the good of peoples. They “must earnestly cherish in themselves, and try to rouse in others, charity, the mistress and the queen of virtues... Selfishness, therefore, is the most insidious enemy of an ordered society. History shows how hearts are devastated when men and women are incapable of recognizing other values or other effective realities apart from material goods, the obsessive quest for which suffocates and blocks their ability to give of themselves. “In the evening of this life, I shall appear before you with empty hands, for I do not ask you, Lord, to count my works. All our justice is blemished in your eyes. I wish, then, to be clothed in your own justice and to receive from your love the eternal possession of yourself”.

## Impactful memory in this last month :

Around 1 pm some children came running to school saying “JCB aaya hai Madam, aaj ghar thodenge, police bhi aaye hai. Aap log kuch kariye na”... Different pleas but all with an urge of help. As teachers we were at a loss and decided to go with the children to the basti. What we would do, we knew not but saying a prayer in our hearts we set off. So many times we read about bastis in Mumbai being demolished but it has personally never affected me. But standing there as the huge JCBs pulled down the shanties, people trying to save their belongings, the cops trying to maintain order, cries of some women and children, verbal arguments between the people and authorities, some drug addicts trying to run away with the people's loot.. All our children and staff were helping each other trying to save whatever they could. Some of my students came running over urging us to leave the chaos. Tears welled up. I realized deep in my heart a shanty is also a home to someone. It is a sense of security that is getting trampled over. As I went to sleep in the cold night ensuring to cover my children with the blanket, I realized how little I give. And like in all helpless situations, I surrendered to my Lord my limitations and to take care of my school children and their families. And HE did.
