A tribal generates Motivation among the Farmers...



Karunya Trust is been supporting farmers to enhance the farm production and linking them Agriculture department. The training

which they received since four years bore a good result in farm production. With the help of input and practice they have become confident to share their knowledge

and experience to the other farmers. Karunya Trust envisages on community resource mobilization that they themselves become trainers with their

experience of the field. After four years of training and exposure one the farmers from Lavalee hamlet became a resource person for farmers exposure

programme. Mr. Baban Thombre from Lavalee, Ambernath shares his experience with us..... Since many years of cultivation on field, my health started developing many complications with a change of time, the change in climate has led farm activities in stake. We have to spend a lot of money on farm than we used to earlier, ofcourse this happened only due to alluring farm promotional products which gave us income for two years and made our land unfertile. KARUNYA Trust exposure program of Organic farming is becoming beneficial to us; slowly we have been shifting our focus from scientific methods to

traditional practices. I have been attending the exposure program since three years and have gathered sound knowledge pertaining farm production; I have implemented it in my field too. The learning and advantages of it was fruitful which I got privileged to share with tribal farmers of the neighboring hamlets. I am grateful to Karunya trust for giving me such knowledge and making me a confident farmer to practice the method and to educate co-farmers with my experiences. Karunya Trust, your support and guidance proved to be a boon which made difference in our lives.....

Perseverance gives Success...



It is a story of every tribal woman in the project area who goes to forest twice a day to collect wood for fuel required for cooking. Due to climate change the forest department has restricted those women's entry to the forest. It was the only way that women used to find their way out through the forest to gather the wood but that was also lost. Karunya Trust is been

creating awareness among the tribal belt to have household Gas connection facility, whereas for those tribal women to think of having a Gas connection was a strange reality embodied with fear attached to it. The constant motivation building up by Karunya has helped women to apply for the Gas connection and they have persevered until they got it. By December 2016 two

hamlets got 58 gas connections. Today these women are happy that they do not have to walk miles for fuel and are free of tension. Rest of the hamlets are too getting registered for the Gas connection, by the end of 2017 we envisage that 75% of our tribal households will get Gas connections in their homes.

Karunya Intervention in Zilla Parishad School...



I am Mrs. Charushila Mahajan, a teacher in Kuradpada School, Ambernath Taluka. I am grateful to Karunya Trust for their personal love showered for the children's wellbeing. Since parents are

uneducated they never bothered to mind the study and regular school going habit of their children. Today in my school, education of children is improved and children are regular in school because of tuition center run by

Karunya Trust. Besides that, Karunya Trust have also provided Sanitation unit facility for the school, This has not only kept the environment clean but also children are cultivating habits on how to use the toilets and latrines properly, it will surely promote open defecation free hamlet in the future. Our children have become much healthier and have observed no more anemic category due to availability of nutritious food supplied from the Divine Mercy Prayer Group, Dombivli, facilitated by Karunya Trust. Long live Karunya Trust and a Big Thank you for the Humanitarian work.

A Motivation for Cultivation...



Karunya has focused its attention to landless tribal's, who worked on others farm as a laborers, filling others barns with grains and they have remained the borrowers for survival. Since May 2016 Karunya Trust created awareness to take the land on lease or half share cultivation, landless farmers have a sufficient grains for the year. 18 families cultivated on others farm for the first time from Kalyan and Ambernath Taluka. Pawar, from Savarewadi shares her joyful experience of having sufficient grains for the family.

"My room is full with paddy and for the first time I have seen 10 quintal paddy in my house. Since Karunya Trust motivated my

family we have earned such a good yield from the small field we had hired, Seeing the room with paddy grains my husband and my eyes were filled with tears of joy, there is satisfaction in us for the hard work we had put in. I am grateful to Karunya for showing me the fruitful and fulfilling way. I have already have booked two more fields for the coming year, I will never turn back from cultivation and motivate others for the same.
