MAKING AN

Magic of Lamit Ark



Kunde tribal hamlet consists of 68 families of 282 people whose main occupation is farming. They were using chemical pesticides on crops but as

other beneficial pollinators also got affected, it led to decrease in yield. Our KT team discussed the advantages of organic farming and



described the benefits of lamit ark. On 7th January 2021, our team trained seven women farmers on how to prepare it systematically. The solution was then diluted in 1:3 ratio in water and sprayed on infected areas. Spraying twice a week gave good results. The leaf hopper infestation got cleared within 20 days and plants became healthy. It has resulted in an increase of 5-6 kg yield per plot. One of the beneficiary women said, "It is budget friendly, easy to make and effective."

Conservation of Culture



The people of Poi, a small hamlet, have adopted the new-age common culture, have slowly giving up on their traditional ways. However, they did not have the necessary documents as caste certificate and hence were unable to avail benefits of government schemes and students could not get scholarships. Our team discussed this with the sub-division officer who suggested issuing caste certificate on the basis of their traditional lifestyle. The locals agreed and also decided

to preserve the Adivasi culture and create their own identity by conserving their traditional language,

culture, dressing, rituals etc. They also plan to make a small museum of their traditional farming and hunting equipments.



Green Initiative at Forest Land Women get Water to Village

KT has been working in collaboration with Forest department for the past

four years. Every year our team organizes a plantation drive in July. Till now KT has planted 500 saplings on the land of conserved forest. On 13th March 2021, 18

Youth volunteers of Sacred heart Church, Ambernath along with four of our staff members came forward for weeding

and mulching of area surrounded by plants. Now the plants are getting water more effectively and growing healthy.



Water scarcity was the main issue in Kelni a small village, where women had to buy and carry water in pots (6-8 liters) from the owner of a nearby well. It was a constant struggle to get the basic necessities of life for these people. In 2017, after being guided by our team in one of the

awareness programs, the women of the village got together and presented their problem to Gramsabha. After four years of struggle, on 4th December 2020 the officials installed the pipeline for water tank. Now they get water on regular basis.

A tribal hamlet, Dahivali, consists of 53 families from Katkari and Thakur

community. People collectively solve their issues through common

village meetings. On 12th November 2019, the people discussed a major issue for which they needed to find a solution. Every day their womenfolk used to walk through uneven bad roads barefooted to fetch water from the nearby stream. Carrying water-filled vessels on that path was a very challenging task. Our team guided the villagers to present the matter in

Gramsabha. Finally on 22nd February 2020, the road was completed in a day and the people got some relief.





Dialogue with Nature




A one-day training program on Key Strategic Pillars - An Approach to Sustainability, was organized by Caritas India, on 20th January 2021 at our KT Rural project office at Badlapur. On 21st January 2021 Mr. Melvin, Assistant Manager - SP from Caritas India visited four

tribal hamlets in Kalyan Block. i.e., Poi, Kelni, Kunde and Belkarpada. He emphasized the need to connect our work with a sustainable approach. One of the parameters was 'Dialogue with Nature'. The green cover of planet earth is reducing day by day, and it is our responsibility to plant

more trees for a better future. KT received some fruit saplings/seeds (cashew, guava, jamun, amla and custard apple) from the Forest Department. Mr. Melvin along with the villagers planted the saplings with a promise by them to take care of the plants.



Seminar on Mental Health



A seminars was conducted for children on Mental Health. There were two sessions on 3rd and 11th March. Around 146 children actively participated in both the sessions. Information on how to handle stress and get rid of the negative emotions and thoughts was shared. The coordinator Mr. Milind explained the disadvantages of negative thinking and benefits of meditation. He also discussed child abuse and the meaning of good touch and bad touch emphasizing on the safety of the children.

POCSO Act



On 23rd January 2021, Savli Project organized online session for children on the 'Protection of Children from Sexual Offences' (POCSO) Act. Adv. Chinmay Jawle, gave

information on the Act and the Constitutional Rights of the children. He said that unlike the common perception, boys and girls are equally vulnerable to sexual legal action through the NGO, police, and social workers. He also explained fraud messages, pornography and shared Child Help Line number and email contacts of organizations that can help in protecting child rights. Children were informed about the punishments and fine if they fall into such crimes. Around 46 children participated in this session along with all the

offences and one can take

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

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COVID-19 safty net to the needy...



Karunya Trust Donated 400 ration kits of Rs.1000 each to Mumbai District Aids Control Society (MDACS). These kits will be distributed to 400 HIV/AIDS infected families who have lost jobs and are affected by COVID-19. On behalf of MDACS, Additional Director Ms. Shrikala

Acharya received ration kits which would be distributed to the needy people through various BMC hospitals in Mumbai.

Online Classes



During this pandemic all work has become online and all schools are taking online classes. We are also doing the same. This year there were 18 students for 10th std (NIOS) through Unique school and 12 other students. When Gyansaathi started

classes it was challenging for children and teachers to adapt to the new method of learning as many did not have mobile phones plus the place had network issues. However, we got many volunteers to teach and complete the syllabus. We took an online exam through

Google form. This year a study counsellor helped the children to develop interest towards study. We also conducted awareness sessions, study plan sessions, career guidance sessions, life skills for children online.

Mask Making Initiative

Report from the Urban project

Gyansaathi teachers had 'Art and Craft' sessions with students using available household resources. Children drew

pictures and decorated them with grains, seeds, leaves, pebbles and other local materials.

Food Grain Distribution



Most of the underprivileged people especially the daily wagers have been seriously affected due to the pandemic lock-down.

People are surviving with minimum food and some of them some have even gone without food for days. Gyansaathi organized food grain distribution for 350 families. Teachers and parents strictly followed government's safty norms during distribution.

Career Guidance for 10th Students



Gyansaathi arranged the Career guidance session for 10th standard children at Prafulta Psychological Center. Career guidance is the programme where students get to know

about their ability through assessment. The trainer took the assessment of children on different subjects like maths, science, languages, etc. and conducted their IQ test. These sessions conducted by Prafulta with children and their parents help them to choose a career.

Mask Making Initiative



Gyansaathi took an initiative to provide a

source of earning to the underprivileged as many

lost their jobs and were therefore unemployed.

During the pandemic when no one was coming out of the house, an order to make masks for Police and other government officials was given to the beneficiaries. Gyansaathi Vocational beneficiaries made the masks and completed the orders on time. Total 22,628 masks were prepared and distributed to government officials and needy people.

Providing Supplementary Nutrition



In Savrewadi a child of 8 months named Darshan lost his mother due to sickness. His father works as a daily wager. Darshan was undernourished as his father was unable to provide child supplementary nutrition.

He had to look after three kids. Bharti, an active member of SHG, discussed this issue with our staff. We gave support to Darshan's family and provided supplementary nutrition on a regular basis. Our staff told them how to prepare the

formula of supplementary nutrition and Bharti collects it and gives to Darshan regularly. Now she has started giving him semi solid food too. Darshan's health has improved now.

Self-help is the **Best Help**



Sangita, a resident of Warewadi, regularly saved regularly Rs. 100 in her SHG account. Our staff motivated her to start a business. So she took a loan of Rs. 10,000/- from the SHG and Rs. 5,000/-

from KT and has begun selling vegetables. Sangita buys vegetables from local farmers and sometimes from the local market. She is able to earn around Rs. 800/- per day by selling it to the nearby

villages. She can now support her family and earn good profit. She has become a role model for other members who wish to become active business women.

Putting the Learning to Use



Gulab, a member and president of Pimploli wadi SHG, is very hard working and positive thinking person. During the pandemic her family faced financial crisis because her husband did not have any job. To fight against the situation she made use of the training given by Project CF. The training was on mix cropping. She did not have any money but had her own land. Gulab and her husband started cultivation of mixed cropping in her farm, from which she earned profit of Rs. 15,000/-. She thanks members of KT for motivating and supporting her with such useful training.

Impact of CF networking



Chon is a tribal hamlet. The ZP school of Chon has 65 students in the school. The school has a total of 4 classrooms. The tribal children study here. However, the students were deprived of basic facilities due to the negligence of the authorities. Earlier the school had two units which

were demolished later.

With the collaboration of Rotary club, 5 new toilet they were daily wagers units: 2 for girls, 2 for boys and 1 for teaching staff income, which led her were constructed. They also provided water tank with a capacity of 1000 liters. This was possible because of regular follow up of school principal, good networking and rapport.

Way to a Bright Future



Sugandha is the president of Jivdani SHG. Her family of five includes her husband and three daughters. During the pandemic both husband and wife lost their jobs as and had no source of family into starvation. But Sugandha did not lose hope. In the SHG she was trained in business plan. So she started a small business to support her family. KT helped Sugandha to buy a handcart. Now every

morning she buys vegetables in bulk and sells door-to-door. In the evening she sells snacks. She earns around Rs.500/- per day. Sugandha says, 'this job is better than working as a labourer'. Her husband supports her in her work. She is grateful to KT for the economic support and promises to repay the entire amount very soon. Sugandha has motivated other SHG members to start a small business like her and become selfdependent.

Child Rights Situational Analysis training

Our staff learnt different methods to find out the children's situation and violation of child rights. After getting this training we conducted

similar sessions with community women and ex-students and also found the facts and situation about child rights in their community.

CF Forum

they overcame challenges and exchanged ideas on activities conducted during the pandemic, participants were divided into groups to present certain topics. Our KT team's presentation on business plan, CLA formation communication and conflict management was well received. A field visit was also arranged to see different types of business and check dams.

Women's Day: In Poi people did not participate in any activity or program and there was minimal involvement in any meetings to solve the issue. After an awareness

program by our team, the people started to come together. On 8th March 2021 under the guidance of Karunya, Womens Day event was celebrated. The people performed their

traditional 'tali-dance' Sarpanch madam motivated the villagers to arrange more such programs.


