applies not only to individual Christians but to the church as a whole. The church defined itself in the Second Vatican Council as a sacrament - a universal sign and instrument of God's salvation through Jesus Christ. If the church is a sacrament of God's love in Christ, it is also a sacrament of God's mercy.

Therefore the command for the church to be merciful is grounded in the identity of the church as the body of Christ. The church is not a kind of social or charitable agency; as the body of Christ, it is the sacrament of the continuing effective presence of Christ in the world.

It is the sacrament of mercy as the "total Christ" -

> When he was asked, "Who is my neighbor?" he did not give an abstract answer. He told a concrete story, the story of the good and merciful Samaritan. This is exactly how God himself deals with us. God bends down in order to raise us up; to comfort us and to heal our wounds; and to give us a new chance, to bestow on us new life and new hope. Mercy is the name of our God. Mercy is the call to be a human being, who feels with other human beings who suffer and are in need.

Mercy is the call to be a real Christian, who follows the example of Christ and meets Christ in his suffering brothers and sisters. Mercy is the essence of the Gospel and the key to Christian life. Mercy is the best and most beautiful news that can be told to us and that we should bring to the world. I am very happy that our social action department doing a wonderful job in this world.

My family has sufficient food for a year...



am Anata Persu Bhagat from Warachiwadi, Ambernath Taluka. I am handicapped by birth and totally dependent on my parents. We are a family of ten people and have one acre of land; Traditionally we cultivate paddy in our field during the monsoon season and use to get only ten to twelve quintals of paddy from our hard work. Our land had damaged bunds which could not conserve sufficient water for the paddy needed.

In Karunya Trust's water and soil conservation projects my father submitted needed documents and got the benefit to build the Bund. In March 2015 my family did the bund work in our land. During monsoon the rain water remained in our field and soil

too did not get drained and for our surprise the help of Karunya and the hard work of my family gave good yield, from ten quintals to twenty five quintals of paddy. Every year we use to purchase the grains, because we never got sufficient grains earlier. This year we have sufficient food and for the entire year. My family and I are grateful for this help. There is profit in bundmaking and we will maintain it well.

Many lives can be saved if vital organs such as the Heart, Liver, Kidneys, Lungs and Pancreas are available for transplant. Unfortunately in our country, the availability of organs is abysmally low and thousands of patients die each year waiting for organs.

While the law permits live donor transplants only amongst close relatives, it does little to make available the organs to the needy patients who neither have suitable close relatives, nor the organs, which, by their nature can only be received from a deceased person.

There are 2600 patients waiting for Kidney, 180 for Liver and 15 for Heart only in the city of Mumbai, registered with ZTCC.
