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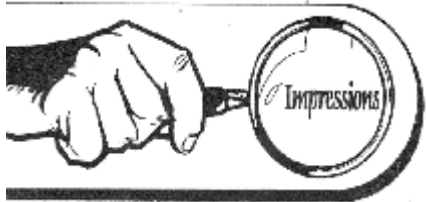

## KARUNYA IMPACT

### Gyansaathi: A model for secular India

**I am Sakeena..** Although, I come from Mumbai, the city of dreams, I’ve always lived in realities that couldn’t be harsher for a nine year old girl. Living on the edge of Asia’s largest dumping yard, my nine-member family was closer to realities, making me wonder what dreams are.

I will tell you some secrets about our area. Chup ke chup ke in the group the children take button, ganja, chillum etc.

after which they say bad words and abuse each other. Very often I hear missing cases of children. Our houses are demolished by the municipality periodically. I am frightened seeing such a large number of police & big machines that break our houses.

**Is it my mistake that I am born in this environment?** Young and confused, when I was only coming to terms with my fate as a rag picker, a stranger came by. My mom did not make it easy for him, she would not allow him anywhere around our hut, but he was a persistent man... his name was Salman Sir. Thus, **GYANSAATHI came into my life.**

In the first year at Gyansaathi we were around 100 children. All of us learned to read Hindi within six months. And today after 3 years we 304 children study in 13 schools both BMC and Private. Here, we get our lunch from ISKON, with very hygienic and yummy food. We have wonderful counselors with whom we share all our problems and fears. At Gyansaathi we have Children’s Parliament where we voice out what we need to do for the betterment of our health, school and community. We girls shied from stepping foot on the play ground. Today, we girls get together for a game of football. On several occasions we were taken to many different places like Nature Park, museums and so on that my idea about the world has opened up.

But it was not always all this easy for my teachers. Most of the times when our teachers approached the BMC schools for our admission they refused and sometimes they humiliated our teachers. Our teachers persuaded and finally they fought for us with Right to Education act.

A whole lot of ideas are discussed by our teachers and Ammis on hygiene, education, child marriage, home budgeting, better job opportunities etc. I heard one of our Ammi saying that “no more will we get our children married off before the age of 18”. 92 of them opened bank account. And our Ammi’s Adult literacy class was formed with 35 members. This group was taken for various exposure visits. Today, four of them are enrolled into NIOS. 28 of them passed their tailoring courses. 15 of them completed beautician course..

**Our inspector uncle once said “Gyansaathi is a model for secular India”. Most of us are Muslim children, our teachers are Hindus, Muslims and Christians and our school is supported by a Christian Missions.**

Our teachers love us so much. They always dream about us and say you all will become great people in life. The greatest gift Gyansaathi brought to our lives is Self respect and self esteem and awareness of our Rights. Today one of our students is a teacher at Gyansaathi. One day we will take up this Mission in our shoulders.

### Karunya gave hope in my life

My name is Rajmatti Devi, I live in Samrat nagar area of Thane. I run a Pan Shop. I have my Husband and 2 children. My Husband works in an industrial area. While working in an Industrial area my Husband met with an accident and he was needed to be Hospitalized. My husband was requiring blood on an urgent basis. So he was provided blood from the Hospital

My Husband was leading a normal life. Then suddenly after about 2 months his health started getting deteriorated. We went to different doctors but were not able to detect what is the problem. One day Karunya Trust team had come to my Pan shop and was discussing about HIV disease. That day I came to know that HIV can be spread through blood transfusion as well. So Karunya Trust team asked both of us to go for an HIV testing. We both attended the Karunya Trust camp and unfortunately both of us myself and husband was detected HIV positive. We were very much disturbed on how we will live this life ahead but Karunya Team counseled us and we decided we will take our medicines and live our life from now. And till date we take our medicines in time and we thank Karunya Team for saving our life.

### I am indebted to Karunya Trust

Pragati Self Help Group from Mulgoan was formed on 5th August 2007 under the guidance of Mrs. Bharti Animator of the Karunya Trust. In our group there are 10 members my name is Ms. Anjana Kathora, I am the president of the SHG. I had acquired the skill of making cloths bags but I had no means to start my own business. Thus I took Rs.500/- from SHG as loan and brought the needed material to make bags. I made the bags and sold for Rs.2000/- which increase my confidents and in small scale I started to make bags and sell. Meanwhile from My SHG four more joined me in learning and acquiring the skill. We five of us started to make bags by taking loan from the SHG. But the real difficulty was not making bags but finding market for it. We all women were not well financially and could not effort to make product and keep it.

At this fearful and anxious moment we meet Fr. Paul the director of Karunya Trust who was passionated by the bags and the quality of bags. He assured us to support in finding the market. He encouraged us to make more bags and brought the bags from us and put up the stall in various parishes which. Which gave good support and response from various parishes to put up the stall in their parishes. Karunya Trust has a greater role in advisiting our bag product. With the help of

Karunya Trust staff we managed to enter in the Mahalaxmi Saras. This Saras is organized by District Rural Development Agency Thane, all over India people come to put up the stall and this Saras has the capacity of 850 stall.

First time we put up the stall in this Saras. We did not have much experience in selling our product but by constant visit and support of Karunya Trust staff enhance our confident and courage. In this Saras we got first prize for the best stall and sell of the year. Now every year we are putting a stall in the Mahalaxmi Saras, though which we come in touch with many people and company and many give us order.

Today we are indebted to Karunya Trust and every member of Karunya Trust for becoming for us a facilitator and enabling us to stand on their own. May Karunya Trust live long and fill the lives of the people with hope and happiness.

### Karunya Trust: Ray a hope in my life

I am Sakku Shudhakar Kata. I have a son, when he was 3 years old I lost my husband the sole support of my family. We were living in a small hut. One day my hut caught fire and lost the only security which I had possessed. I had no one to support me financially and no other means to rebuild my hut so I started to live under a tree. The shade of the tree became our home. Many times Government official came and took the photo of my pathetic condition of my living. No aid was materialized... only promises... We continued to stay under a tree for 5 years. Now my son is 20 years old ... a marriageable age. Since no houses so nobody wanted to give a girl to him... this all lead me to get addicted to alcohol. Tension, poverty, lack of daily work and above this the work I get I was paid less wages. It was very difficult to manage day today’s affairs. I was totally disappointed and had no hope in the life to live. In these circumstances Karunya Trust team came to our village to do PRA. I cried and said to them in that PRA my need to have a house. I was not in a situation to build my house even if they give me money so two of their staff build my house and I and my son supported them by doing helper work. Today Karunya Trust has become my God and with their help I have got the security of life...hope for future...I has reduced drinking alcohol and above all my son got



married last month. Today you see me smiling. For years I had lost this beautiful smile on my face. Karunya Trust members have given me back the joy of life. I thank God for them and wish that Karunya Trust who is known as the friend of the poor may live long and bring the joy and smile on many more faces which is lost from the face of the needy and helpless.

When I was working at the site, Karunya Trust team came to us and started explaining about HIV/AIDS disease through body mapping and condom demo. After hearing



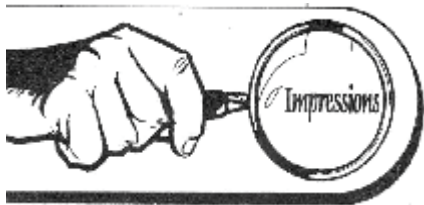

9th & 10th Standard Tribal Children with Solar Lanterns distributed by Karunya Trust under Bharari Project Karunya Trust is supporting 1600 Tribal Children & their families in Ambernath Taluka.

Today's world education has become competition. Every parent wants their children to score above 95%. But our tribal parents are contented and satisfied if their children get just passing marks. Our tribal's are far behind the social stream. But when it comes to the children they want to excel in their exams but at times circumstances don't allow them, such as some tribal villages have no electricity and if there is it is often they face power cut. Especially night hours when children can sit and study silently there is no light. This is the reality rural villages. Moved by this reality Karunya Trust distributed 40 solar lights to the 10th students. The faces of the student became as bright as the solar light. The eyes were shining with joy because they were supported at the right time and moment of their life. Yes, Karunya reaches to the less privileged brothers and sisters of our society just on right time. It is said when one door is closed God opens another window. Possession of the solar lights by 40 students leads them to experience the God of light leading them to better future. One of the students with joy exclaimed, "May the Karunya trust become light to our tribal community and lead us from darkness to light, from death to life and untruth to the truth and freedom.

46 students from Gyansaathi attended a Scout and Guide three-day camp held at Ambernath. This was the first time the students stayed away from their homes. They received trainings in salutes, manners, hoisting a flag, etc.

### Love & Trust which binds us with our tribal communities

"What so ever you do to the least of my people that you do unto me"

This is what we live in our relationship with our tribal villages. With our unconditional acceptance and our selfless efforts we strive to bring them in the main stream of society. Our love for children leads us to accompany them in goodness and wellbeing. Our approach makes them feel loved, wanted and cared in society which does not recognize them. Our Various activities makes this bond strong.

**Education:** Tribal parents have understood the importance of education it has lead to reduce the drop out from the school. Constant awareness and different village committees like village education committee (VEC) and Village Development Committee (VDC) participation has improved the status of education. Tuition centers help children to improve their standard. Education material given for 300 children have brought regularity in school attendance. Adult education has motivated women to write and read their names it

has led to increase their participation in the various meetings. Different training programmes such as leadership, status of women, sex education etc. has brought greater awareness among the community members. Our rapport and support with the government teachers has also motivated all the teachers to work hard for children's bright future.

**Health:** Health is wealth but our tribal community is far away from this reality. Inorder to promote good health. We support 157 malnourished children of 16 villages with nutritional supplements. 19 pregnant women had their medical checkup and are supported guided for the purpose of safe delivery. Time to time health & hygiene awareness is imparted. Three village health camps were organized with the support of Dr.Rasal. Almost 400 people enjoyed good medical treatment. Two handicapped children are being consulted for the future treatment so that they live a normal life.

**CBO formation & strengthen:** We motivate and enhance the formation of various community based organization for the better development of their own community. We have 52 Self Help Group and 6 farmers clubs. Their participation in the group is being encouraged by motivating them to take up the income generating Schemes. All the groups are learning to do the banking and the transaction of the bank. Unity and WE feeling is increasing in the community. Every member is taking responsibility and playing an active role in doing something for the development of their own community.

**Children's parliament:** Children have begun to understand the role and responsibilities of being the member of the children's parliament. We had various activities for the children such as sports competition, speech competition and children day celebration, election for the minister post and it was an eye opening for all, that our tribal children are not less than city children. They are equally gifted and talented. What they need is a platform to express their talents. A person to motivate and encourage them.

**Livelihood:** We impart the knowledge on various livelihood methods and means which can be adopted by our people. So through the CBO we have promoted four persons to take up livelihood project such as Vegetable selling, chicken center, papad making and saloon shop. These four persons will be supported financially and guided for the business by our team. We are also motivating vegetable cultivation and soil and water conservation through the land improvement.



We alone cannot reach out to all. We need your help and support. Join with Karunya Trust and become the agent of love and service to the suffering humanity and raise their life to full human dignity.

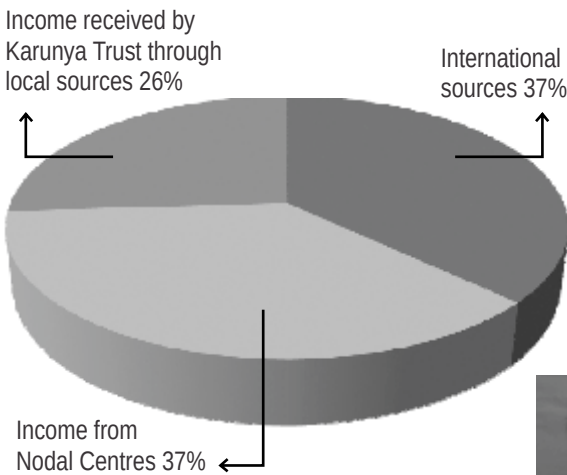

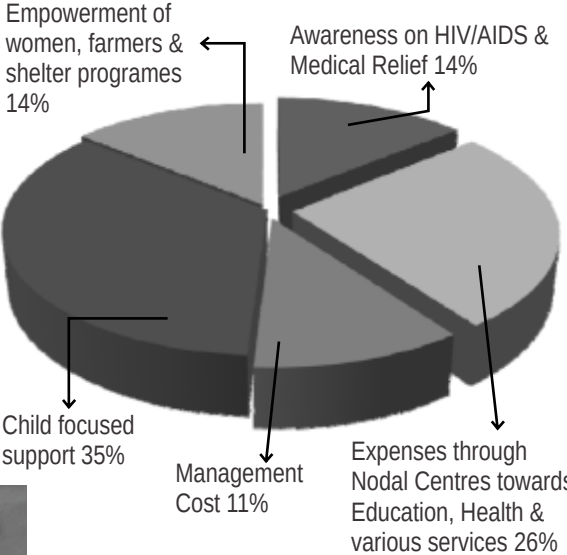
