TBR Nutrition and Health Camp

TBR provides nutrition which has right amount of carbohydrate, vitamins, protein, fats and minerals as per an individual's requirement. From Monday to Saturday TBR snacks are provided to the

children during study time which includes: Biscuits, Bajra Mix, Namkeen Murmura, Soyabean Masala, High Protein (Mix Pluses), and Khatta Meetha Murmurra. Nutrition Monitoring Forms have been given to all the group teachers to fill on daily basis. Ms. Neelima from TBR and their team of 7 doctors

conducted health assessment of children with complete health checkup of each child including noting height, weight, BMI, Head Circumference, proper dental, eye, ear, skin and scalp checkup were done by the doctors. TBR health camp gave a clarity on the health deficiency of the children.

"I never got opportunity to show my talents but today I feel proud because of Karunya Trust who gave me opportunity to bring out

my talents and made me feel that God has blessed me with many talents. Due to poor family background I was left alone but organizing such programs for the children helped me to feel accepted. The love and joy Karunya Trust staff shares is remarkable." said Gyaneshwar Mirkute.

Forest Right Act, Helped to achieve our goal



Adivasis have lived in the forest since ages but still they don't own their land and are strangers in their own land. According to The

Forest Right Act (FRA) set in 2005 and implemented in 2006, tribal people have rights to claim the land. But due to lack of Information and

ignorance people did not have knowledge on FRA. This incident happened in Mhasrundi hamlet, Thane district of Kalyan Block. Karunya Trust staff gave information on FRA and facilitated the people the process to claim their land.

"On May 27, 2017 we wrote an application and submitted to Van Hakk samiti (Forest Right Committee). One day they came to visit my farm with a map of the land. After that visit, on enquiry, I said "I cultivate paddy and Ragi(Nachani)". After 3 months, FRC called special Gram Sabha to sanction individual claim" said Dunda Bangare "On August 15, 2017 we actively participated in

Gram sabha and raised our issue. FRC passed our 35 Individual claims and they submitted to Dy. Collector level committee" said Sarita

Waghchaure "On Feb 1, 2018 we visited Dy Collector office and enquired about our 35 new individual claims. That visit was



very helpful for us as they gave valuable ideas. We gave written application to Collector office and Dy. Collector office and requested them to do a reality check visit to our farm. Why our claims are not sanctioned? First time we spoke with government authority. We followed the process of Regular visit and submission of application and follow up", said Ganesh Waghmare. Finally we succeeded, we got 26 new individual claims We are very happy because we achieved our goal... our dream... we got forest land

Collective efforts helped to raise voice...



Thakurpada is a small hamlet of 22 families of Thakur community belonging to Schedule Tribes situated

in Group Gram Panchayat of Goveli Taluka, Kalyan Dist. Thane. “Special Gram Sabha was never organised in

our village. We were not informed about the Gram Sabha whenever it is conducted in the village so we were not aware of

it”, said Savita Sawant, an active member. “We women never speak in front of men so we never try to go to Gram Sabha. Lack of participation in Gram Sabha made us ignorant of government schemes for a long time. Karunya Trust gave us awareness about Gram Sabha. Gram Sabha is important soul of Village development”, Manisha Hindole. “The presence of 100 women in Gram Sabha is not mandatory. We were made aware that Gram Sabha can be conducted even in the presence of few women from the village. Therefore, we decided to demand for Gram Sabha on 15th

August”, Anjana Hindole. “We all came together and wrote an application regarding special Gram Sabha. We submitted the applications to Gram panchayat and Panchayat Samiti. But we got the reply that Gram Sabha will be conducted on 29th August instead of 15th August. Then collectively we discussed the topic and the village problems to be forwarded in the Gram Sabha. We discussed on having a proper constructed road, Gaothan issue and community hall in the hamlet and 15 % funds for women welfare”, said Kamalabai.

“On August 29, Gram Sabha was held in our hamlet and 50 women from the hamlet participated in it. We were able to speak freely in the Special Gram Sabha. We got two resolutions approved in Gram Sabha, the Gavthan issue and Community hall. In the Gram Sabha, we also demanded for business oriented training for women. We completed our work because we demanded and participated collectively in Special Gram Sabha”, said Anjana Hindole the active member from hamlet.
