Every child is a gift of God...

My name is Vikas Gaikwad, a staff of Gyansaathi. Gyansaathi has given me a lot of learning and unforgettable experiences. Working at Gyansaathi, given me a reflection of my childhood, when in those days even I resided at Govandi studying in a BMC school. The only difference I saw was that my parents extended all the support and

encouragement for my education which these children lack. Hence I believe that it is our responsibility to support these children.

One of the unforgettable heart broken experience I came across at Gyansaathi was that on a friday, a 4 year old boy who had just returned from his village had an accident. It was a Friday, a day of

Jumma (Prayers). It is a day when bathing is compulsory for them. While the boy's mother was making hot water in an aluminium vessel, the boy accidentally jumped into the vessel suffering 60 per cent burns as declared by the hospital. Since in the hospital, there was no burns ward the doctors had asked the parents to shift the boy to Kasturbha or Sion. But however due to illiteracy, the parents did not understand the consent letter. On knowing this, then, with the consent of my superiors at work, I had extended support to the boy's family.

However the doctors had given up hope on the boy's survival. All effort had been put in by Karunya Trust to support the family. But sadly the night when a bed was made available at Kasturbha Hospital that night the boy took his last breathe. I was very saddened and shakened by the incident.

I believe every child is a gift of God, created for a great mission. Let us help them to realize their God given potential.

This story is about Shezada Ansari, a student studying in grade 8 at Shankar Rao Vishwas Rao Municipality School No. 28. Shezada is a slow learner who suffers from 40% disability. He was included in the program as per

instructions from the school management.

Case Study:

I'm Shezada Ansari, a student of Municipality school no. 28 and am part of Project Muskan which began in our school earlier this year. There have always been

opportunities for children who are bright in studies, however, for those of us who struggle to grasp concepts there has never been much. Project Muskan has given us not just a shimmer of hope but nurtured and honed our abilities. The kits used in the STEM (Science, Technology, Electronics and Math) lectures are enthralling and help us understand the concepts through innovative means. Through Project Muskan, we were taken to the Planetarium and the Nehru Science Centre. It was an invigorating

experience that helped satiate my thirst for knowledge about the sciences and space. A street play was also conducted in my school which served as an eye opener as it emphasized on the importance of education and the struggle our parents go through to impart it to us. It is quite unsurprising, therefore, that I have never missed a single lecture conducted by Project Muskan. My only regret is that I won't be part of Project Muskan next year as I will be in grade 9. I am indebted

Change through iSAVE...



Every person being needs sufficient income to fulfill their basic needs and for earning sufficient income they should have skills. We identified their need and started Tailoring classes in the name of Institute of Social Animation Vocational

Education (iSAVE). Sonavale and Aghanwadi were two centres identified and classes were started for 40 students and successfully completed by 30 students.

I am a resident of Sonavale village with 5 members in my

family. My husband is the only member and we were not well off. I belong to Jaswandi Self Help Group (SHG). In our SHG we discussed about opening a tailoring class in our village. I become a member of Sonavale tailoring center. I am educated only till 5th std and

didn't know how to measure or write or stitching or using a sewing machine. Our tailoring teacher, Mr. Bandhane taught us very well and through the motivation of Karunya Staff, I became independent after learning tailoring. In the course of three months I could stitch different types of designer blouses, frock, chudidar dress, gent's shirts etc. Karunya Trust provided me with a new sewing machine for regular and sustainable income and also helped me to open bank account. Thank you for giving me this opportunity and for changing my life.

An Eye check up camp was organized by Karunya trust with the collaboration of Amber eye care center, Thane at Pimploli hamlet on March 23, 2017. 83 people benefitted from this camp. Out of 83 people, 10 were identified for cataract operation.

Testimony- I am 60 years old resident of Pimploli village. From my childhood I can't see properly from my left eye. I was totally neglected by my parents and family regarding my eye issue. My family and I

thought this is a natural default in my eyes and had superstitious belief. I got an opportunity to check up my eyes in this camp and found retina problem, but I was not ready to except the reality. Team of Doctors and Karunya Trust staff counselled me and made me understand there will be no harm to my eyes. The operation was done successfully by the team of Amber eye care center thane and now I am able to see this beautiful world. I am from a financially weak and my whole family depends upon seasonal farming. Cost of operation was more than 15000, but due to the initiative of Karunya Trust and help of Amber Eye care center my operation was done free of cost. I thank them all.

Water is LIFE - Project SUJAL



Chhone hamlet has 113 households with 600 population. Only 3 wells are available from past 20 years for drinking water. Out of three two wells are not

useable for drinking water. The whole hamlet depends upon only 1 well. Women have to go up to one km distance to bring drinking water. Four groups of Self Help Groups (SHG) came together to discuss this issue. They approached Gram Panchayat and submitted application. The response was very disappointing They approached Karunya Trust for help. With the help of Karunya Trust (KT) animator,

they held a general meeting for discussion on repairing bore well to reduce water problem in the community. People collocated Rs.100 per household. With the help of KT animator, community members received Non obligation certificate (NOC) from Gram Panchayat and community members

decided to work voluntary as per requirement.

Finally work was done by attaching 5000 litres water tank connected to the borewell and four taps join to the tank. Finally, the community has safe and clean drinking water.

We came together and cleaned our well...

It was great day of the people of Kelni Adivasi village at Kalyan Block, as people from this hamlet arranged safe drinking water with their own efforts. Kelni hamlet people were struggling to get drinking water. Community people mostly women and young girls struggled to fetch water for house hold use due to lack of water availability in the area. They had to pay Rs. 200. per day per family to buy daily drinking water from other caste



people who have their own borewell.

Since the Gram panchayat was not responding to the problem positively, with the encouragement of Karunya staff,

villagers came together and approached Gram Panchayat to resolve the issue. But nothing constructive happened. A common meeting was conducted to discuss

the problem. With the facilitation of Karunya, it was decided to clean the wells with people participation from the villagers. 26 people (man, women and school children) came together with needed Equipments and worked to remove the silt from the well and cleaned it. People are happy that their problem is solved with collective efforts.

We, the Jivdani Mahila Bachat Gat, have been residing at Devloli Adivasi Hamlet since 50 years. The hamlet comprises of 19 houses. We have two self help groups that is facilitated by Karunya Trust. We work at the brickkilns and fields of the high class people who show interest only in our regularity of work. Since we are daily wage workers, we have to borrow loans from the owners, owing to economic compulsions



confronting our day-to-day life. We then work on their field or brick kilns, for repayment and thus

making us bonded laborers and leading us in the bondage of debt. Since 50 years now, we have no water facility

in our hamlet. Women have to fetch water from far distances, which is a much more difficult task than the

household and daily wage work. Several initiatives to the government official or the land owners had been made for water supply but no heed was paid to our request. Our self help group then made a firm decision on constructing a borewell. We have not left any stone unturned, in achieving our task. With firm spirit, we continuously kept demanding and knocking the doors of the Gram Panchayat and Block Office. Finally, fed up with our constant visit and

continuous follow up on the task, they provided us with the sanction of the borewell. Truly it is the hard work of our group that today we have water facility in our hamlet. We owe all credits to Karunya Trust, especially to Sangita Tai, who always guided and helped us to persevere the entire process. By Jivdani Mahila Bachat Gat (Jivdani Self Help Group)

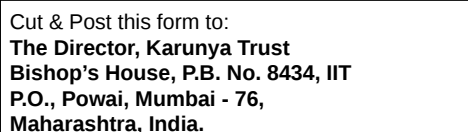
